
### The Health of Our Church

In the last few years our church has become a lot busier with people committing, connecting, and contributing more.

Although increased activity leads to increased costs, our finances mirror the story of a healthy church, with narrowly balanced budgets and resources applied to things that are more likely to serve the community and grow the church.

### **How We Compare**

Ministry here can be quite expensive, but, proportionately, we are typical in the way we use our money. Like most healthy churches, our largest areas of expense are staff and facilities (though we spend marginally less on these because we have an efficient experienced team, and we own our property).



### Income & Expense

Your giving provides 90% of our income. Most people tell us in advance what they intend to give. This is by far the most helpful thing to do, because without an early response from you, it is impossible to set an accurate budget.

To get a balanced budget, we usually have to hold back on some plans. If we generate a surplus, it is most likely due to unexpected income, (people exceeding their intentions, or new members joining). When this happens, we typically use the money to make capital improvements, which makes the church more efficient to run

The money we'll receive for our building development will not count as income. We're saving that until we're ready to begin construction. People are welcome to contribute to the Building Fund at any time, but our priority has always been the regular operation of the church.

### **Our Vision for 2024**

The Vestry's immediate priorities are to meet budget and offer cost of living raises to the staff. To accomplish this, we need income to increase by 4%.

With a little more, we'd be able to improve some of our programs, and in the longer-term future, we'd love to increase the responsibility of some existing members of staff, train and launch a newly ordained minister, increase mission, and fund a church retreat.

### **What Next?**

Our biggest challenge is knowing what everyone intends to give in time for our budget meetings.

You can share your intentions by using the website, app, attached form, or the link in the e-mail that you will receive from Niki with your giving record.

In return, we commit to keeping your financial details confidentially, to spending every Kingdom dollar as those who answer to Christ, and to ensuring that a summary of the church's finances are published monthly, audited annually, and reported promptly to our diocese.

## The Theology of Giving

All members of Christ Church agree to serve and give as they're able.

We don't prescribe a specific proportion or amount that people must give but the way we respond to God financially is possibly the easiest way to find out how serious we are about our faith. Paul even says that if our giving is not abundant like God's then our faith might not be genuine at all (2 Cor. 8:8).

For those wanting a rough guideline, many commend the consistent biblical practice of the tithe or 10% of income, and point to its clear endorsement by Jesus (Mt. 23:23). Others find this approach too restrictive and point to the sacrificial nature of Christ's giving to us, looking for a symbolic response from us that is much greater than a tithe.
